NOTE TO PHYSICIAN: This product reacts with water in the acid contents of the stomach to form methanol. The combination of visual disturbances, metabolic acidosis and formic acid in urine is evidence of methanol poisoning. The therapeutic intravenous administration of ethanol (10 mls/hour) allows methanol to be preferentially oxidized and reduces production of methanol metabolites. Acidosis must be treated with intravenous administration of sodium bicarbonate and methanol elimination may be increased by hemodialysis, as indicated. Treatment should be based on blood methanol levels and acid-base balance.

NOTICE OF TSCA USE RESTRICTIONS AND REQUIRED CONTROLS FOR SIB0959.0 BENZOYLOXYPROPYLTRIMETHOXYSILANE

Dear Customer:

The chemical product purchased, SIB0959.0 has been granted a Low Volume Exemption by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) under the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA) regulations (40 CFR 723.50). Any manufacturer or processor who intends to use this chemical substance for commercial purposes must comply with the specific use restrictions and controls specified as follows:

USE OF THIS CHEMICAL SUBSTANCE IS RESTRICTED TO: Application as an adhesive promoter/surface treatment.
